In the Charge Conference report for 2009, some of the expenses for maintenance and upkeep of our church facility were listed. There were actual outlays of funds, not including volunteer labor. The amount was about \$42,000, which represents one year.

You may not have realized the expenses of caring for our campus and buildings. There is an immediate need for roofing repairs to Koinonia and other areas that is estimated to cost \$20,000.

We are asking, if you are able, to contribute to the Building Fund to assist in continuing the care FUMCOR must have. Thank you.
